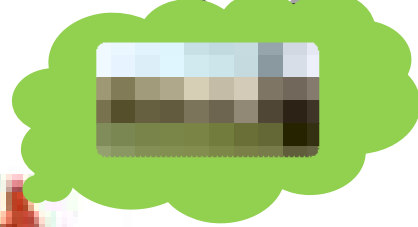
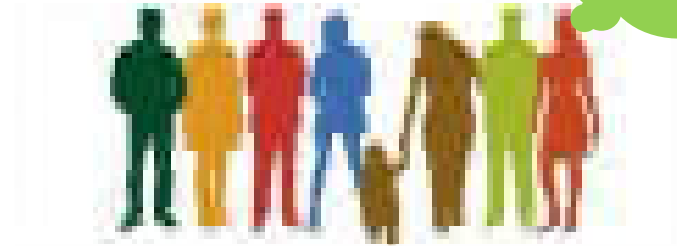


Trend 1: Human Kind Needs More From The Planet

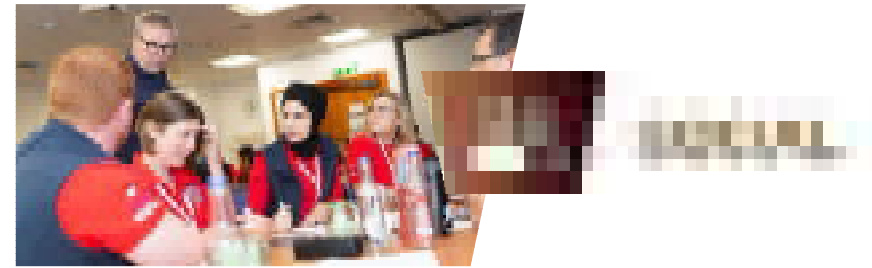

FAO-IPC Declaration of Sao Paulo, August 2019: The IPC identified the 5 SDGs where the poultry meat industry can make the most difference.

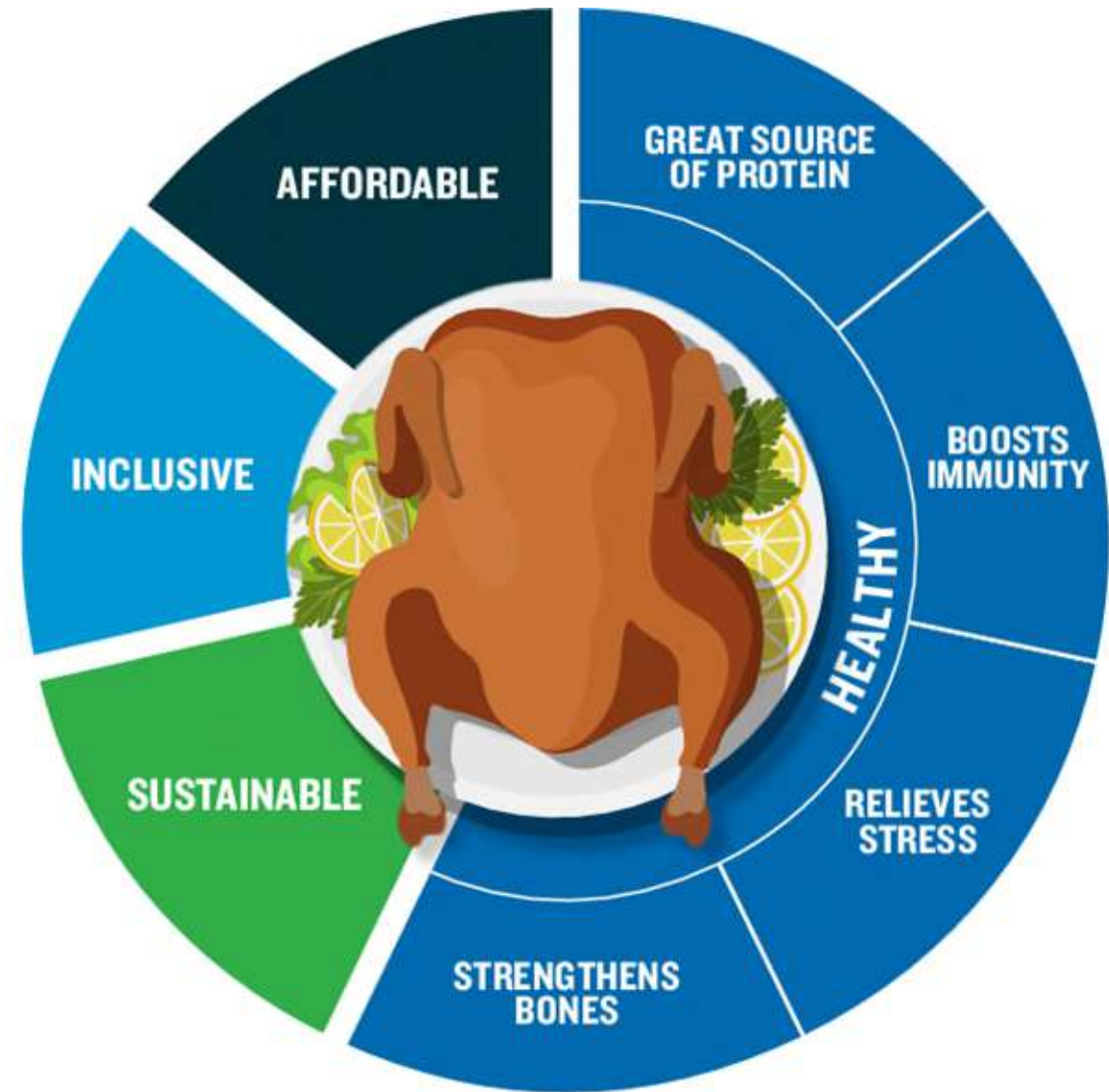

Management Skills **Key** to Welfare Outcomes

Overlap between different farming systems

Mostly about management if resource based “bonus” not included



Animal Based: mortality, footpad, hockburn, breast irritation, scratches
Resource/System Based: stocking density, early feeding, enrichment

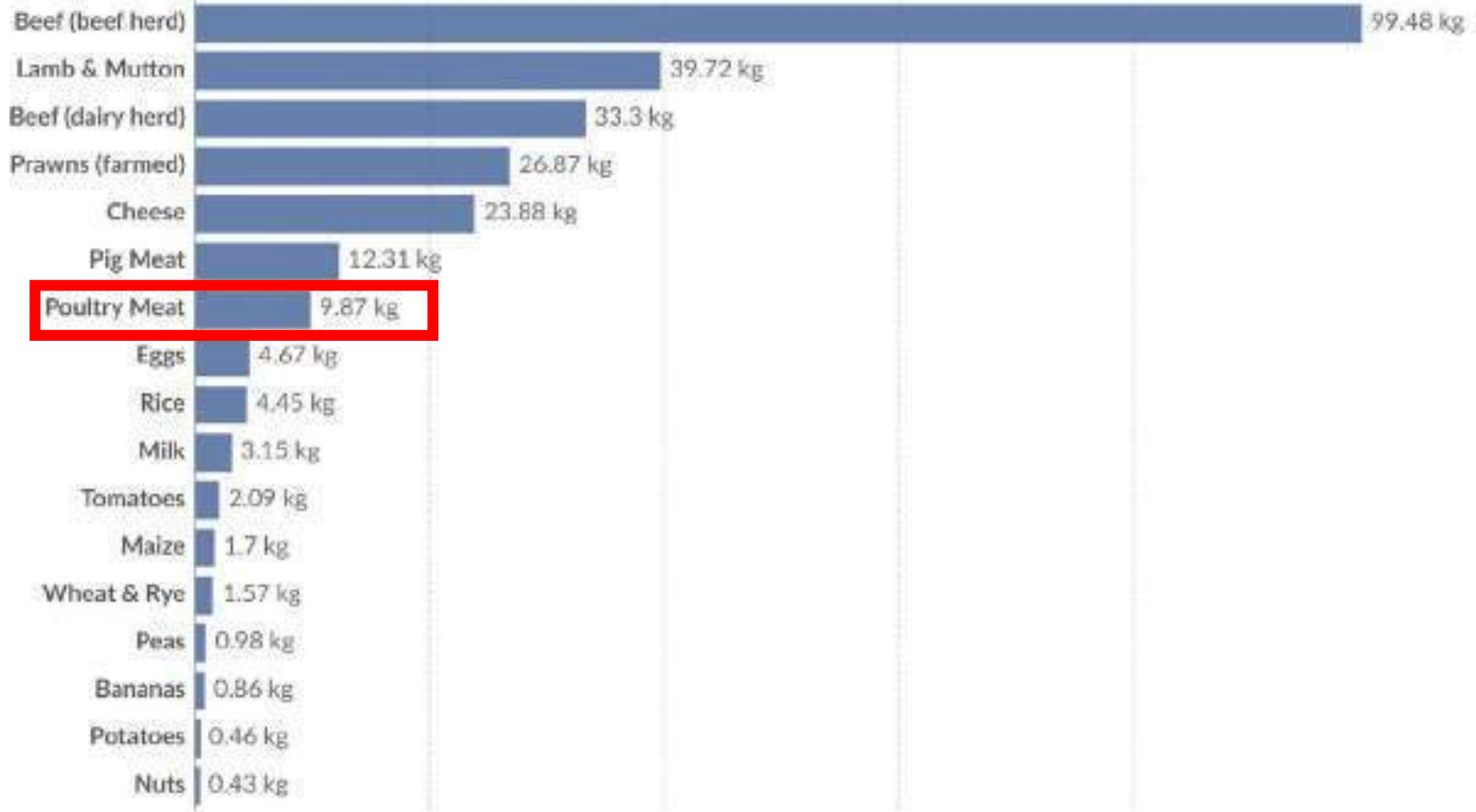

Emissions are measured in carbon dioxide-equivalents¹. This means non-CO₂ gases are weighted by the amount of warming they cause over a 100-year timescale.



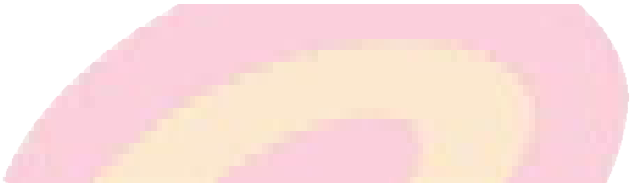

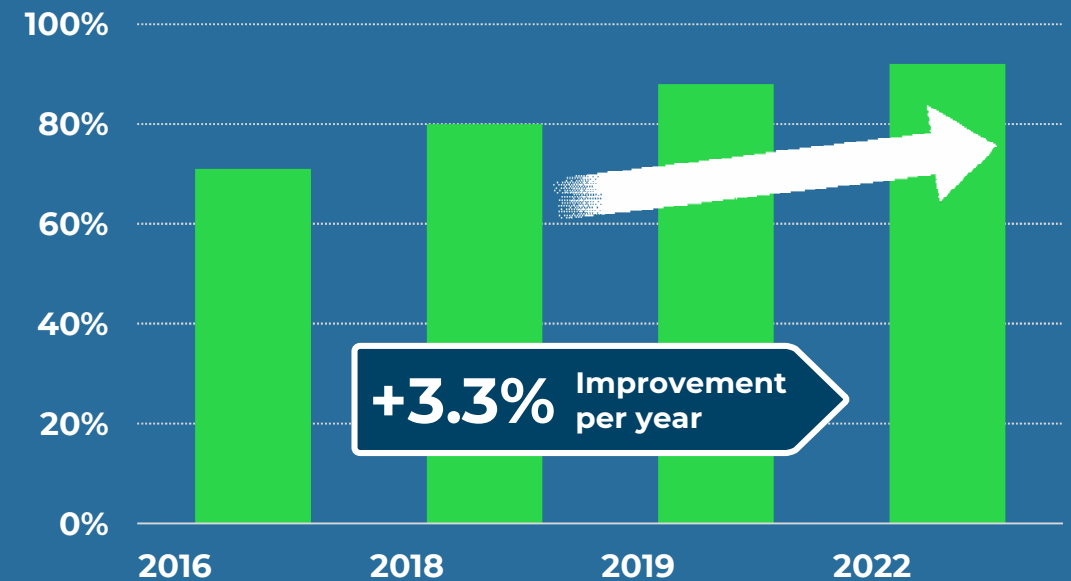

% DEFECT FREE – ROSS 308

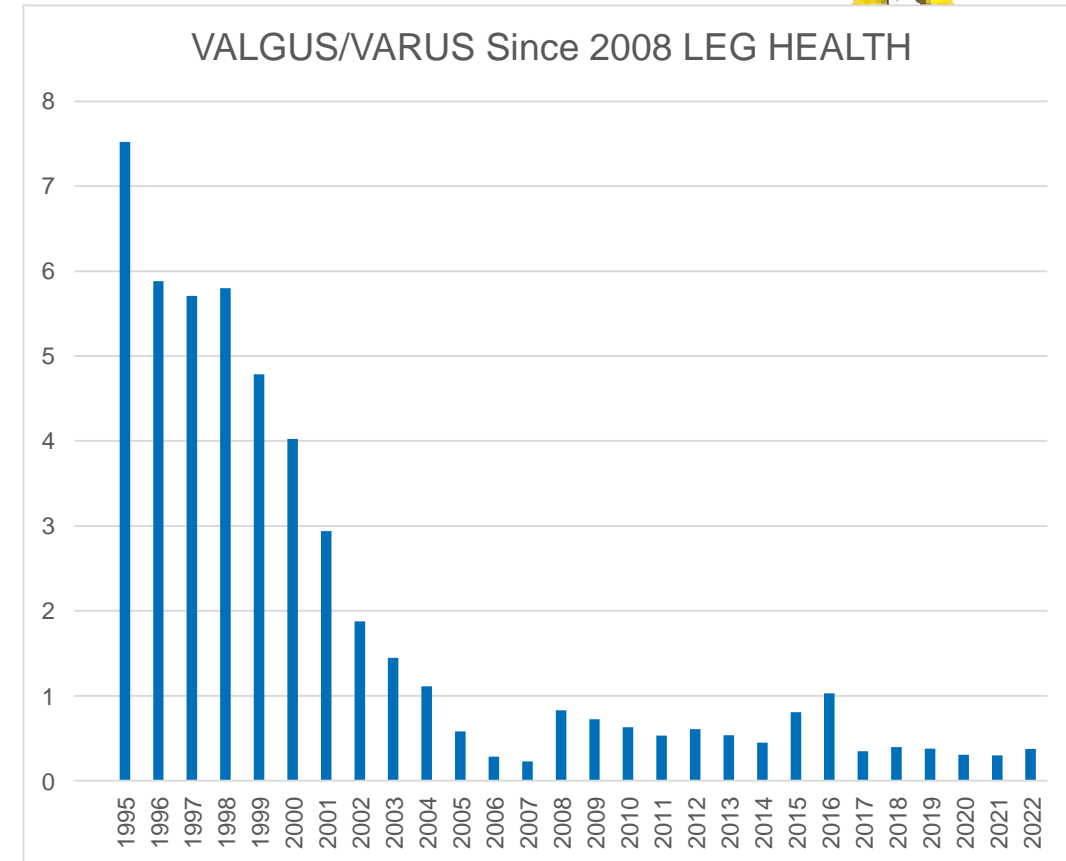
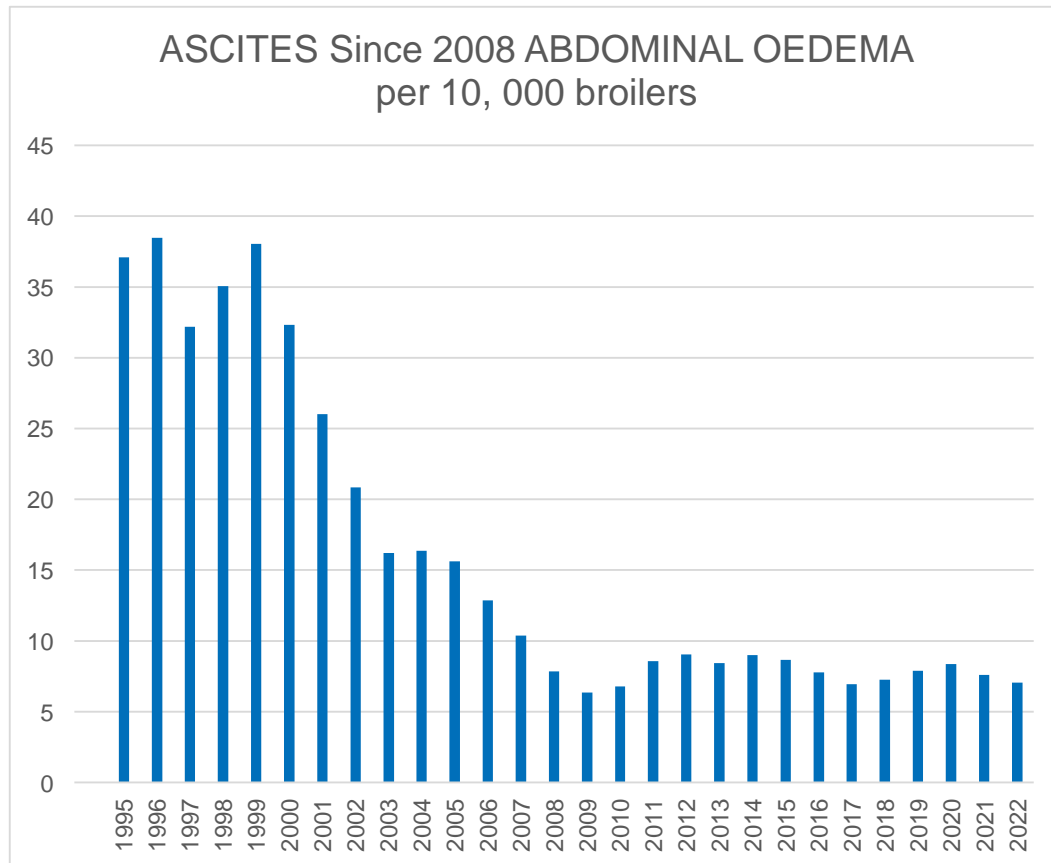


% GOOD GAIT SCORE – ROSS 308

Importance of Management and Stockmanship



Extensive management support and education since management factors influence 70-90% of the health, welfare and performance of a flock.

- Best practice management
- Greater success through knowledge sharing
- Integrating bird welfare



Best Sensor on the Market

Hearing

Listen to the bird's vocalization, breathing, and respiratory sounds. Listen to the mechanical sounds of fan bearings and feed augers.

Smell

Keep notice of smells in the environment such as ammonia levels. Is the air stale or stuffy?

Sight

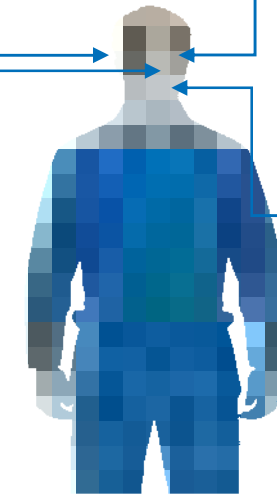
Observe behaviour such as bird distribution in the house and a number of birds feeding, drinking and resting. Observe the environment such as dust in the air and litter quality. Observe bird health and demeanor such as positive, alertness, eyes and gait.

Taste

Water and feed quantity.

Touch

Handle the birds to assess crop fill and check the bird's general condition. Take notice of air movement across your skin. Is there a draft? What does the temperature of the house feel like?

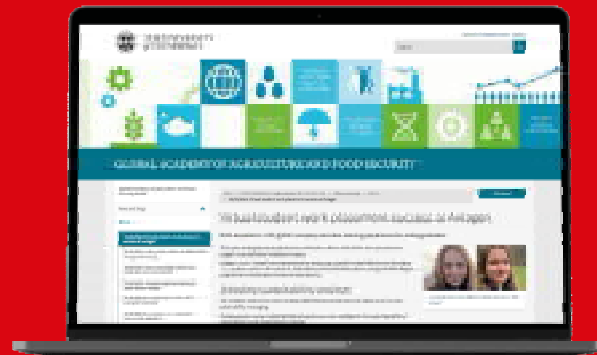
